Chocolate Chocolate Zucchini Cake

1¾ C. Sugar	2½ C. Flour
½ C. Margarine	4 Tbsp. Cocoa Powder
½ C. Oil	1 Tsp. Baking Soda
½ C. Sour Milk*	½ Tsp. Baking Powder
2 Eggs	2 C. Grated Zucchini
½ Tsp. Vanilla	(Squeeze out liquid)
½ Tsp. Salt	1 C. Chocolate Chips

Cream sugar and margarine.

Add remaining wet ingredients mixing after each.

Combine dry ingredients and add to wet mixture.

Fold in zucchini and chocolate chips

BAKE at 350 for 45 – 60 minutes

Bundt pan usually takes 60 minutes

*To make sour milk – measure 1½ tsp. lemon juice or vinegar into glass measuring cup. Add enough milk to make ½ cup

Make a homemade crazy sprinkler out of a plastic bottle



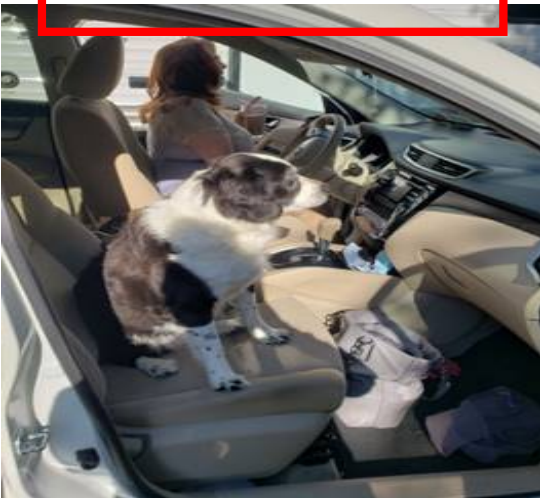

DIGNITY OF THE HUMAN PERSON

The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. This belief is the foundation of all the principles of our social teaching. In our society, human life is under direct attack from abortion and euthanasia. The value of human life is being threatened by cloning, embryonic stem cell research, and the use of the death penalty. The intentional targeting of civilians in war or terrorist attacks is always wrong. Catholic teaching also calls on us to work to avoid war. Nations must protect the right to life by finding increasingly effective ways to prevent conflicts and resolve them by peaceful means. We believe that every person is precious, that people are more important than things, and that the measure of every institution is whether it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of the human person.

1. When we fail to acknowledge as part of reality the worth of a poor person, a human embryo, a person with disabilities – to offer just a few examples – it becomes difficult to hear the cry of nature itself; everything is connected. **(Pope Francis, *On Care for Our Common Home*)**

2. The dignity of the individual and the demands of justice require, particularly today, that economic choices do not cause disparities in wealth to increase in an excessive and morally unacceptable manner. **(Pope Benedict XVI, *Charity in Truth*)**

3. Human persons are willed by God; they are imprinted with God's image. Their dignity does not come from the work they do, but from the persons they are. **(St. John Paul II, *On the Hundredth Year*)**
